Al Report

Highlights

- The meeting opened with a prayer thanking for the success of the last election and seeking guidance for future elections.

- An audience member questioned Joel Rudman's confidence in his campaign, to which he responded by asserting his commitment to the community and his political stance.
- Another audience member challenged Rudman on his previous comments about cybersecurity, leading to a heated exchange.

Recognition And Gratitude

- Candidates were recognized for their commitment to public service and their willingness to engage with the community on important issues.
- Candidates expressed gratitude towards the audience for their support and participation, acknowledging the importance of community engagement in the political process.
